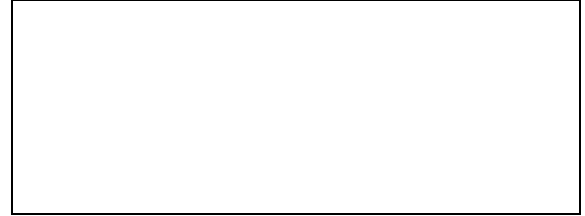

What conifers grow the fastest?

White Pine followed by Norway Spruce.

What deciduous trees grow the fastest?

Poplar and Tulip.

What are the most popular Christmas trees?

Fraser Fir, Doug Fir, Balsam Fir, Colorado Blue Spruce, and Scotch Pine consistently rank highest.

What if I have deer?

Avoid cedar and fir trees, unless precautions are used to deter deer.

When should I order?

Ordering by March 12 is recommended for best selection.

The Tree & Shrub Annual Seedling Sale enhances forestry, wildlife habitat, and the economic development of Jefferson County. The products we offer help to conserve our natural resources.

Payment must accompany your order. We reserve the right to refund payment if items are unavailable. All plants are bare root seedlings and must be sold in quantities of 10 or more (NYS law).

The success of your planting is not guaranteed due to planting techniques and weather conditions.

Orders will NOT be shipped.
